Basic skills include concepts such as the alphabet, numbers, colors, and shapes. Fine motor skills are movements that are produced by small muscles or muscle groups. Children in preschool spend a lot of their day developing these muscles in their hands. Developed motor skills are the key to success in school.

Young children learn best when they are actively involved in the learning process. *Let's Learn to Paste* features whimsical hands-on activities that children will love to complete. The act of pasting and manipulating small objects will help your child develop fine motor skills. Developing fine motor skills is an important part of the brain development. This book was designed to be completed with the child and parent working together to maximize learning opportunities. Try completing a couple pages a day with your child. There are directions for parents and simplified directions for the child. Allow your child to decipher and explore the activity on his or her own, but provide guidance when needed. 


Paper Chain


Skill: Making a paper chain

Look for a fun extension activity on page 61.

Paste a paper chain.










Polar Bear Puzzle

Funny Farm


Skill: Pasting pieces together to finish a puzzle




Berry Time




On Top of Spaghetti




Circus Seal

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


Flower Garden




Skill: Pasting objects on a specific spot



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


One Turtle


Skill: Learning number 6




Skill: Learning number 9






Masterpiece!

Extension Activities for Pasting

Use the following hands-on activities to enhance your child's fine motor development. Keep in mind that the process, not the finished product, is what is important. Work beside your child and model various pasting activities for him or her.

Paper Chain

Your child can use the paper chain he or she created in Activity #1 or paste together strips of scrap paper to create a chain. Your child can use the chain as a calendar counting down to special events. He or she will tear off one link each day. This is a great subtraction activity.

Your child can also make a memory chain. Help your child by writing a milestone or a memory of a special day on a paper link. Your child will keep adding paper links to create a chain of memories

Collage Book

Help your child make a collage book. Paste or draw a large letter in the middle of the paper. Your child will find pictures that begin with that letter sound and paste them around the letter. Your child can find pictures from magazines or use the leftover shapes from Activity #13 through Activity #22. Focus first on letters that are in your child's name. Then, branch out to other letters in the alphabet.

Counting Game

Collect or buy craft sticks. Write numerals on one set of craft sticks. Add some tempera paint to white glue. Help your child place colored dots of glue on the other set of sticks to correspond with the numerals. Let the glue dry. Then, you and your child can play a matching game, matching the numerals to the dots by counting the dried glue dots on the sticks. See if your child can close his or her eyes and count the number of raised dots on a stick by using his or her fingers.

Puzzle Pieces

Choose pictures from magazines. Cut the picture into halves or fourths. Give them to your child to reassemble and glue onto a piece of paper.

3-D Sculptures

Collect juice bottle caps, foam packing pieces, empty containers, uncooked pasta, dry cereal, cotton balls, cotton swabs, and any other items your child could use to create a sculpture. Your child will use glue to build a sculpture using the materials you provide. This activity provides a great opportunity to talk about ways to recycle or re-use items you might otherwise throw away.

Window Decoration

Provide your child with buttons, a margarine container lid, and a long piece of string. He or she will cover the inside of the lid with a thick layer of glue and add the buttons. You will place the hanging string in the glue so that a good portion of it is hanging off of the glued section and set the lid aside to dry. Then, pop the dried glue out of the lid and hang the decoration in your child's bedroom window. Now, your child has a beautiful window decoration!

Glue Glop

Gather several small glue bottles. Add a teaspoon of tempera paint to each bottle, using a different color in each. Stir with a craft stick. Open the tips of the bottles so that only a small amount of glue can come out.

Give your child a white piece of paper and let him or her drizzle glue on to the paper. Encourage your child to move the bottles around and look at the patterns he or she is creating. Not only is this tons of fun, but it is also a very soothing activity for children. Store your child's creation in a safe place, away from curious hands, and let it dry.


Dot-to-Dot

Mix glue with tempera paint. Help your child place dots of glue on a piece of paper. Let the glue dry. Then, your child can use a crayon to connect the dots.

Your child can also lay a piece of paper over the top of the dried glue and use the side of a crayon to create a rubbing of the dots. He or she can move the paper around and switch crayon colors to create a unique piece of art.
