According to studies conducted by the World Health Organization (WHO), more people die from pollution from vehicle exhausts than from car accidents. Road transport is responsible for one-third of the harmful air pollution. Additionally, the study found that in the three countries (France, Austria, and Switzerland), long-term exposure to pollution causes around 21,000 premature deaths per year. This number is significantly greater than the 9,947 fatalities recorded that year due to vehicular accidents.

The researchers also found that 15,000 children were admitted to hospitals with worsened heart disease due to pollution, and 300,000 children were **<u>diagnosed</u>** with bronchitis as a result of vehicle emissions. They determined that 27 billion Euros was the annual cost of dealing with all of this. Spending on vehicle safety features outweighs efforts to reduce air pollution.
