To become the main language of international communication, English has grown from a language that few people spoke 600 years ago. By the time English became what it is today, around 1350, **it** had taken on many French traits that came from the Norman invasion of 1030. Up until the 1600s, most people only spoke English in England. It hadn't even spread to Wales, Scotland, or Ireland.
