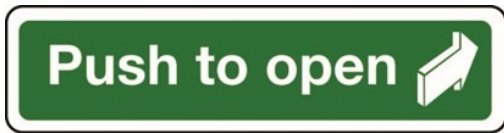

### Great Little Inventions

Throughout history, many small inventions have had a huge impact on our lives. Some of these inventions are so simple that we often take them for granted, yet they have revolutionized the way we live. For example, the paperclip, invented in the 19th century, is a small and simple device, yet it has helped people organize papers in offices and homes around the world.
