Over 2,600 years ago, humanity made the initial discovery of electricity. That come as a surprise to you ?. In that distant past, there were no lights, telephones, refrigerators, radios, motion pictures, or television sets. Of course, there were no television sets either. You might be wondering how electricity could be any older than Thomas Edison's invention of the first practical electric light bulb in 1879. All of these modern conveniences are of such recent development that you might be wondering how electricity could be any older.

Electron, which is the Greek word for amber, is where the word "electricity" originates from. Amber, which is the fossilized sap of a pine tree, has the appearance of a **solid** lump very similar to honey. Six hundred years before the common era, a Greek philosopher by the name of Thales polished a piece of amber by rubbing it against his sleeve. He discovered, much to his delight, that the rubbed amber attracted small pieces of lint, feathers, and dried leaves. This was a very interesting discovery. He was under the impression that only amber possessed this peculiar quality of attraction, which he believed was unique to amber. Thales's early discovery of amber is still considered to be the origin of the word "electricity."

An English physician made the discovery that other substances also possessed this property of electricity, which was more than two thousand years after Thales made this discovery. From that point forward, an increasing number of men contributed to the advancement of knowledge regarding electricity. They were the spark that ignited the many innovations and discoveries that led to the current era of electrical technology that we are living in.
