THE INNER PLANETS

Planets are large bodies that rotate around the sun. The inner planets, or terrestrial planets, are the four planets closest to the Sun: Mercury, Venus, Earth, and Mars. Even though these planets are all small and rocky, they have differences than they have things in common.

Because Mercury is the closest to the sun, the side that faces the sun gets as hot as 427 Celsius. At the same time, the side that faces away from the sun is a freezing -173 Celsius. The extreme temperatures alone make it a very unlikely place for life. With an atmosphere too thin for human breathing, it's obvious that people won't be living on Mercury any time soon.

The next planet from the sun is Venus. Below clouds of sulfuric gas lies 96% carbon dioxide atmosphere. That might be nice for a plant, since a plant "breathes" carbon dioxide, but not for a person. If you managed to survive the atmosphere, the surface of the planet is hot enough to melt solid metal. Venus has temperature that is maintained at 462 Celsius, no matter where you go on the planet.

You are probably most familiar with Earth because it is your home planet. It has the perfect conditions for life. Earth's atmosphere and oceans help contro; the trickiest part of making a planet life-friendly: temperature. Earth is the only planet known to have liquid water.

Mars is the fourth farthest from the sun. Some people think it may be possible for life to exist there. Although scientists have not been able to find actual water on Mars, there seems to be evidence of water erosions on its surface. Its canyons and mountains are very similar to those found on Earth. The main difference is that there is no plant life. Some sicientists believe that Mars may have been very much like Earth until something happened that made the water supply evaporate.

The moon very likely has a very small core, just 1 to 2 percent of the moon's mass and roughly 420 miles (680 km) wide. (37) _ , but may also contain large amounts of sulphur and other elements.

Its rocky mantle is about 825 miles thick and made up of dense rocks rich in iron and magnesium. Magmas in the mantle made their way to the surface in the past and erupted volcanically for more than a billions years – (38) _ .

The crust on top averages some 42 miles deep. The outermost part of the crust is broken and jumbled due to all the large impacts it has received, (39) _ . Beneath its surface, the Moon's core is believed to be partially molten, extending about 250 miles (400 km) in radius. This core is made up of iron, with small amounts of sulfur and nickel. Despite its small size, the Moon's core plays a significant role in generating its weak magnetic field. Scientists theorize that the Moon once had a stronger magnetic field billions of years ago, but over time, as the Moon cooled, (40) _ . This decline in activity also impacted its geological features, making the Moon geologically inactive today compared to its volcanic past.
