Summary of Procedures

The usher introduces the child to the examiner. The examiner asks how old the child is.

1. The examiner asks the child to describe several differences between the *two Find the Differences* pictures, e.g. ‘In picture 1, the bears are brown but in picture 2, the bears are black.’
2. The examiner tells the child the name of the story and describe the first picture, e.g. ‘Helen visited her grandparents last Sunday’. The examiner then asks the child to continue to tell the story.
3. The examiner shows how to do the task with the first odd-one-out set of pictures. For example: ‘These are all places. But this is a room in a house’. Then the examiner asks the child to choose one picture in the other three sets and say which is different and why.
4. The examiner asks questions about the child, e.g. ‘Where do you live?’
