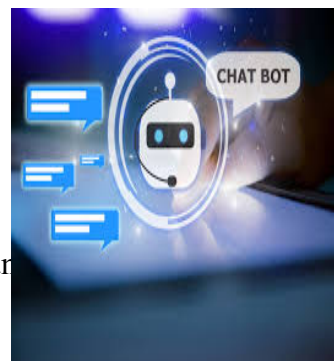

CAREER PLANNING

Choosing a career after leaving senior secondary school is particularly important to students. Below are some practical tips for **successful** career planning.

Making a list of job options is the first step in choosing a career path. A generation is a group of people who were born at roughly the same period and age, within 15-20 years. [I] People who were born at various times and in various circumstances have different opinions depending on the experiences they have had. [II] It is true that the ways people live have evolved along with the times and many seem not to want to **compromise** their views and beliefs. [III] There have always been attitude differences and misunderstandings between the younger and older generations, which is called the generation gap. The gap, which is widened by this mindset, is starting to negatively impact people's lives. [IV] Even so, it's not always clear how generations are divided and to which a person belongs.

People categorize different generations under various names, from Baby Boomers to Gen X, Millennials, Gen Z and the newly emerging Gen Alpha. Baby boomers are people born during the baby boom between 1945 and 1964 when the birth rate in several countries, most notably the United States, Canada and New Zealand, **skyrocketed**. This generation witnessed the entire technological evolution and the development of the media. Despite having adapted to a new technological world, they are less reliant on smartphones than the later generations. As with the Baby Boomers, Gen X'ers are the most technologically relevant generation of the modern era, acting as a bridge between older and younger populations. **They** were present at the birth of the Internet, video games and artificial intelligence and they are the population responsible for many of these advancements.

People who were born between 1980 and 2000 are referred to as Millennials or Generation Y. Because many people believe they place too much focus on themselves, they are also known as the 'Generation Me Me Me'. They are reliant on their smartphones since they grew up with technology. Generation Z, born between 1995 and now, excels at multitasking. **They are quick thinkers who**

become impatient when something does not happen quickly. They don't give much thought to themselves. Instead, they concentrate on global issues such as terrorism and global warming. Alpha is the youngest and first generation born in the twenty-first century. Since their parents grew up using the Internet, mobile devices, tablets and social media, they are the first generation to have been born. They also tend to be the most technologically advanced and racially diversified.
