### **Ethnic Diversity in Vietnam**

Vietnam is a multicultural country with 54 ethnic groups, each having unique traditions, customs, and languages. The Kinh people, who make up around 86% of the population, mainly live in lowland areas, while ethnic minorities such as the Tay, Thai, H'Mong, and Cham often reside in mountainous and remote regions. **They** maintain rich cultural identities through their traditional festivals, handicrafts, and music.
