While offering **immediate** assistance, UNICEF representatives recognized the necessity of long-term programs to support children worldwide. As a result, the organization adjusted both its objectives and its name. It is now called the United Nations Children's Fund.

To help children around the world, UNICEF currently supports over 100 countries in developing and expanding services. These efforts aim to improve children's health, and reduce preventable diseases regardless of their circumstances.

It also sponsors classes in nutrition, child care, and parenting, as well as in basic education.

Additional funds are raised through the sale of greeting cards, television events hosted by celebrities, and other fundraising activities supported by individuals.
