Living on water

As cities become bigger, those who can't move inland are starting to consider moving out, onto the sea itself. There are already cultures where a life on water is nothing new. Islands made from reeds float in the middle of Peru's Lake Titicaca, home to an **ancient** community. Venice is made up of 118 islands; and the Thai capital, Bangkok, with **its** canals, is famous for its floating markets. **Fishermen live at sea for long periods, but could large numbers of people really move onto the water?**

Koen Olthuis, the Dutch founder of *Waterstudio.nl* and a floating architecture expert, thinks so. His company is involved in a project in the Maldives, a group of islands just 1.5 metres above sea level. By 2100, their beautiful beaches and white sand could be completely underwater. However, before the architects can solve this problem, some cash has to.

to do this, Waterstudio will create a luxury floating development (with a conference centre, golf course and 185-villa resort), and use the money from this to develop artificial islands to provide houses for the Maldives' poorer citizens. As well as building on the water, architects are now starting to think about building *under* the water. AT Design have produced plans for a 10 km² floating city off the coast of Hong Kong, with islands above the water connected by underwater tunnels and walkways. If and when it is completed, the city will have gardens, a huge entertainment arena for sports matches and concerts and even **its** own farms, making it **self-sufficient**. People will be able to travel back and forth from the mainland by ferry, and the designers predict that it will be a huge tourist attraction.

So, it seems that a life at sea will have a lot to offer!

One major source of income related to running is organising races. Cities all over the world host events such as marathons, half-marathons, and 5K runs, which attract thousands of participants. Runners pay entry fees, and companies that sell healthy food or sports equipment are eager to sponsor these events because they want to reach this audience. Races also sell items like branded T-shirts, medals, and souvenirs, which are popular with both participants and spectators.

Another big part of the running business is sports gear. Running shoes are essential, and major sports brands invest heavily in creating high-quality shoes that improve performance and prevent injuries. These companies use aggressive advertising to promote **their** products, with prices for a good pair of running shoes ranging from \$50 to \$250. In addition to shoes, runners often buy special clothing to make running more comfortable. Wearable technology, such as fitness trackers and smartwatches, is also becoming a popular trend.

Nutrition products are another important part of the running industry. Athletes need proper fuel to perform well and recover quickly. Energy gels, protein bars, and electrolyte drinks are common products created for runners. **Although some companies claim their products are specially designed for running, their benefits are not always proven.** However, these items are easy to find in stores and online, making them accessible to runners everywhere.

Social media has also played a big role in the growth of running. Platforms like Instagram and Facebook allow runners to share their achievements, join online groups, and take part in challenges. Influencers and professional runners often **promote** products, encouraging their followers to buy them.
