Key Points to Remember on Traffic Rules in England

Below are some key points you need to remember when you travel in England.

The general rule of keeping left: When you are driving on a road which is a two-way road, you need to allow the traffic from the opposite direction to pass from your right side. Similarly, all the vehices in you lane also need to be giving the right side to overtake.

When you turn: When you are taking a turn, always keep to your turning side, menaing when turining right, get to the right side of the road and do the same when turning to the left.

Do not park: Surely, you want to park your vehicle as fast as you can, but that doesn't mean you leave your car on the side of the road. Find the parking near your building and park it there. If parking is not available, make sure you are not parking near the bus stand, school, or hospital entrance.


