Tatyana grew up in Baltimore, Maryland, and later became one of the best Paralympic athletes in US history. However, she had to **surmount** significant challenges before she achieved great success.

Tatyana was born with spina bifida, a spinal condition <u>that</u> made her suffer from a severe walking disability. In addition, she spent her early childhood in a home for children without families and didn't have a wheelchair to help her get around. However, Tatyana was determined to play with other children her age and soon learned to walk using her hands.

At the age of 6, Tatyana was adopted by a family and she began her new life in Baltimore. She developed a keen interest in sports and took up wheelchair racing at just eight years old. She quickly showed promise in sport, and by the age of 15, she had already competed in her first Summer Paralympics, taking home a silver and a bronze medal.
